The Association received this invitation the board just couldn't turn down—to join Gainesville's big celebration of WW II and Camp Howze, to celebrate our reunion back at the place where the members of the 103d were trained for combat. With an entire city dedicated to hosting the remaining veterans, family, and friends, we had to seize this glorious opportunity. We will time the reunion so that we can all take part in the annual Memorial Day Wreath Laying ceremony at our monument to salute the members of the 103d who gave their lives so that we may all live in peace.

Our reunion will be from noon on Saturday, May 24, through Monday Afternoon, May 26. In keeping with the last year's vote to make reunions more informal, this reunion will be mostly "pay as you go"—though we can assure you that Gainesville will be less expensive than Indianapolis and less restrictive regarding certain activities that our veterans normally participated. Though everything isn't firmed up yet, this is at least some of what you can expect:

Saturday afternoon—Morton Museum of Cooke County tour (in Gainesville), which features a special exhibit "Sentimental Journey"—Camp Howze and the Men and Women of the Greatest Generation. We will arrange a group tour to "step back in history as [you] journey through a re-created Camp Howze. This exhibit will provide a glimpse into a soldier's life on base, as they begin preparing for the battlefields on foreign soil."



LEGACY MILESTONE COMPLETION

In 2010, I asked the membership for funds to acquire microfilm reel copies of the 103d Division Morning Reports from the National Personnel Records Center in St Louis. I'm extremely happy to report that the Morning Report transcription project for all the 103d units from March 1944-July 1945 is now complete—a major milestone in the preservation of the legacy of the 103d Infantry Division of World War II. All of the 103d units' Morning Reports are now posted on the Association website.

Taking over three years to complete, this, to my knowledge, is the only transcribed and searchable database of its kind from the World War II era. It will assist historians and your descendants for generations to come. Also from the transcribed Morning Reports, I've created a byname "Cactus Index" that lists all who served with the 103d and what unit they served with during the March 1944–July 1945 timeframe. 103d WEBSITE UPDATE

A New Year has dawned. While these are sad times as we learn of more veterans passing away. We grieve at their loss, and we can take solace in the outpouring of support from family members of veterans of the 103d Infantry Division to support the preservation of the nation's greatest generation.

Recently, I had the distinct pleasure of speaking with a venerable veteran of the 103d. The essence of the conversation went something like this; anyone can go out and buy a Nazi flag, medals by the dozens, bayonets, uniforms, equipment, and yes even guns from WWII. Museums across the country are replete with displays of these WWII artifacts. Heck, even airplanes, tanks, boats, and other large items are displayed. The old vet asked me, "What do these hard items tell you about the men who used them during the war?" The answer is obvious; nothing except to stand as an example of equipment used. Medals don't tell the story of how they were earned. Next the old vet told me he had looked at the 103d website. His comment, "Now buddy boy, that's history."

Reflecting on that comment here's the meat. Zack Sigler, 103d Archivist extraordinaire, has done a remarkable job in transcribing the morning reports of all units assigned to the 103d Infantry Division. Thanks to Zack's efforts the 103d Association is reported to have the most complete website of any Infantry Division of World War II; and this from researchers. What Zack has accomplished is remarkable. Yet there are others who have made significant contributions toward preserving the history of what the men of the 103d accomplished. David Gilbert and his wife, Linda, made a trip to the NARA to obtain Unit Journals and Operation Narratives; as did Larry & Pat Wayne, all priceless pieces of 103d history. These documents tell a story of men who get their leg blown off and lie in the field while medics do a full leg amputation on the spot. They tell a story of a gas mask which lay for 68 years until found by researchers who read the reports and pieced together its location. How many awards did the Division receive? What were the details? General Orders, acquired by the late Al Eucare, tell of the medals awarded and the heroic actions of soldiers to earn them; in many cases heroism unknown by family members. The General Orders reveal staff assignments, movements, and command changes, like MG Hafner replaced by the legendary BG McAuliffe. Battle Deaths record those who paid the ultimate price for freedom; the work of arduous hours by Mel Wright, Rabbit Wilson, and Jim White. There are oral and written stories from veterans, in their own words, that tell about their experiences. These stories are the work of the Martins; Luke, Gary, Carol and Larry. Many photos, provided by Art Flynn and others, that record details long forgotten. The ASTP program documents the shock of waking up one morning in a school dorm room and the next morning hoisting a rifle in an Infantry Division. There is the story of training locations that prepared 103d veterans for war. Morning Reports don't record awards; just promotions, transfers, punishment, and the fact a casualty occurred. These other documents present the story. Thanks to Bob French's and Francine's trips to document the monuments in France honoring the 103d Infantry Division. Their untiring efforts that led to a monument at the horrific Landsberg concentration camp, liberated by elements of the 103d, which led to this Division honored as an official liberating unit by the US Holocaust Memorial Museum and US Army Center for Military History. There exists much more on the website than the sparse coverage I've given in this account. There are many others who have made contributions to the website; too numerous to list in this limited space.

The point here is that the true legacy of the 103d Infantry Division is preserved. It is already there. It is not a medal, a bayonet or a Nazi flag. Yes, these are artifacts of historical importance, but they don't tell a story. The real preservation of the 103d Infantry Division legacy is in place due in no small part to the countless hours of work done by so many people to collect historical data for your site; the website of the 103d Infantry Division Association of World War II.
