

PVT ROBERT E. SAVORY- (KIA)

410th, I-Company

PVT Savory was born April 15, 1926 in Fresno, CA to Donald and Pearl Savory and grew up in Fresno, and attended Edison High School and Fresno Technical High School. Savory was working at the Wilkerson and Nutwell Foundry at the time he joined the Army on July 25, 1944. Initially, he received Army Air Corps ground crew training at Buckley Field, Denver, CO; however, in Nov of 1944 he was transferred to infantry and sent to Camp Maxey, TX for infantry basic training. Upon the completion of basic he was sent to Europe as a replacement in the 103d Division and assigned to Co I 410th Inf Regt on Feb 21, 1945 near Obermodern, France. On Mar 15, 1945, Pvt Savory was killed by German small arms fire as he was advancing through Urwiller, France. Pvt Robert E. Savory of Fresno, CA lies at rest in the Lorraine American Cemetery at St Avold, France.
